2. SYNONYM CLUES

THESE CLUES PROVIDE WORDS WITH SIMILAR MEANINGS NEARBY. FOR INSTANCE, "THE ANCIENT MANUSCRIPT WAS ARCHAIC, FILLED WITH OLD-FASHIONED LANGUAGE." THE USE OF "OLD-FASHIONED" CLARIFIES THE MEANING OF "ARCHAIC."

3. ANTONYM OR CONTRAST CLUES

OPPOSITE MEANINGS HELP STUDENTS INFER UNFAMILIAR WORDS. AN EXAMPLE: “UNLIKE HIS GREGARIOUS SISTER, TOM WAS INTROVERTED AND PREFERRED SOLITUDE.” THE CONTRAST BETWEEN “GREGARIOUS” AND “INTROVERTED” HELPS DEFINE THE LATTER.

4. EXAMPLE OR EXPLANATION CLUES

EXAMPLES WITHIN THE SENTENCE OR PARAGRAPH SHED LIGHT ON THE WORD’S MEANING. FOR INSTANCE: “CELESTIAL BODIES, SUCH AS THE SUN, MOON, AND STARS, HAVE FASCINATED HUMANS FOR CENTURIES.” THE LIST FOLLOWING “CELESTIAL BODIES” MAKES THE MEANING CLEAR.

5. GENERAL CONTEXT CLUES

SOMETIMES, STUDENTS NEED TO USE THE OVERALL CONTEXT OR TONE OF THE PASSAGE TO GUESS THE MEANING OF A WORD. THIS SKILL REQUIRES PRACTICE AND IS OFTEN EMPHASIZED IN WORKSHEETS BY ASKING STUDENTS TO ANALYZE SENTENCES WITHIN A BROADER PARAGRAPH.
