NOUNS AND ADJECTIVES MUST AGREE IN GENDER (MASCULINE/FEMININE) AND NUMBER (SINGULAR/PLURAL). FOR EXAMPLE, “EL CHICO ALTO” VS. “LAS CHICAS ALTAS.”

QUESTION WORDS

LEARN COMMON INTERROGATIVES SUCH AS QUIÉ N (WHO), QUÉ (WHAT), DÓNDE (WHERE), CUÁNDO (WHEN), POR QUÉ (WHY), AND CÓMO (HOW) TO UNDERSTAND AND FORM QUESTIONS.

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT: SAMPLE EXERCISES AND TIPS

ADDITIONALLY, EXPANDING CULTURAL CONTENT WITHIN THE EXAM COULD FOSTER DEEPER INTERCULTURAL COMPETENCE, AN INCREASINGLY VALUED OUTCOME IN LANGUAGE EDUCATION.
