COMMON ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- **YARD WASTE:** LEAVES, BRANCHES, GRASS CLIPPINGS, AND OTHER ORGANIC DEBRIS.
- **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS:** SMALL QUANTITIES OF RENOVATION MATERIALS SUCH AS WOOD SCRAPS, DRYWALL, AND CONCRETE CHUNKS, DEPENDING ON FACILITY RULES.

ITEMS TO AVOID AT FREE DUMP SITES

NOT ALL WASTE CAN BE DISPOSED OF FOR FREE. HAZARDOUS WASTE LIKE PAINT, CHEMICALS, BATTERIES, AND ELECTRONIC WASTE (E-WASTE) REQUIRE SPECIAL HANDLING AND MUST BE TAKEN TO DESIGNATED COLLECTION CENTERS. TIRES AND LARGE

APPLIANCES WITH REFRIGERANTS ALSO TYPICALLY INCUR FEES OR MUST BE RECYCLED SEPARATELY.

How to Access Waste Management Reno Free Dump Services

GETTING ACCESS TO FREE DUMP OPPORTUNITIES IN RENO IS STRAIGHTFORWARD BUT REQUIRES SOME PLANNING.

CITY-SPONSORED CLEANUP EVENTS

USING PUBLIC TRANSFER STATIONS

SOME TRANSFER STATIONS IN THE RENO AREA OFFER FREE DUMPING FOR RESIDENTS ON SPECIFIC DAYS OR UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS. CONFIRMING THE FACILITY'S SCHEDULE AND RULES BEFOREHAND PREVENTS SURPRISES AND ENSURES A SMOOTH EXPERIENCE.

PROOF OF RESIDENCY AND VEHICLE REQUIREMENTS

PLAN AHEAD FOR LARGE OR BULKY ITEMS

IF YOU HAVE OVERSIZED ITEMS LIKE OLD FURNITURE OR APPLIANCES, CHECK IF THEY REQUIRE SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS OR APPOINTMENTS. SOME FACILITIES MIGHT OFFER PICKUP SERVICES OR CHARGE FEES FOR BULKY WASTE.

PRACTICE RESPONSIBLE WASTE REDUCTION

BEFORE DUMPING, CONSIDER DONATING USABLE ITEMS TO LOCAL CHARITIES OR SELLING THEM ONLINE. REDUCING THE AMOUNT OF WASTE SENT TO THE DUMP IS A SMART WAY TO CONSERVE RESOURCES AND HELP THE COMMUNITY.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF PROPER WASTE MANAGEMENT

RECYCLING CENTERS AND HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITIES

SPECIALIZED CENTERS ACCEPT RECYCLABLES AND HAZARDOUS WASTES, ENSURING THESE MATERIALS ARE SAFELY PROCESSED. THE CITY OFTEN PROVIDES DROP-OFF LOCATIONS AND SCHEDULED COLLECTION EVENTS FOR THESE TYPES OF WASTE.

NAVIGATING WASTE MANAGEMENT IN RENO DOESN'T HAVE TO BE COMPLICATED OR COSTLY. RENO'S MUNICIPAL WASTE SYSTEM IS DESIGNED TO ACCOMMODATE VARIOUS WASTE STREAMS SUCH AS GENERAL HOUSEHOLD WASTE, YARD DEBRIS, CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION WASTE, AND ELECTRONIC WASTE. THE CITY'S LANDFILL, OPERATED BY WASTE MANAGEMENT INC., PLAYS A CRITICAL ROLE, BUT MANAGING THE VOLUME AND ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REMAINS AN ONGOING CHALLENGE.

THE CONCEPT AND ROLE OF FREE DUMP DAYS

FREE DUMP DAYS ARE DESIGNATED PERIODS WHEN RESIDENTS CAN DISPOSE OF CERTAIN TYPES OF WASTE AT NO COST. THESE EVENTS ARE TYPICALLY HOSTED BY THE CITY OR WASTE MANAGEMENT COMPANIES TO ENCOURAGE PROPER DISPOSAL OF BULKY ITEMS, YARD WASTE, OR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS THAT ARE NOT ACCEPTED THROUGH REGULAR CURBSIDE PICKUP.

IN RENO, FREE DUMP EVENTS SERVE SEVERAL PURPOSES:

- REDUCING ILLEGAL DUMPING BY PROVIDING A LEGITIMATE, COST-FREE ALTERNATIVE.
- ENCOURAGING COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION IN WASTE REDUCTION AND RECYCLING EFFORTS.

TECHNOLOGICAL INNOVATIONS AND FUTURE TRENDS

2. **PREPARE WASTE PROPERLY:** SORT MATERIALS IN ADVANCE, SEPARATING RECYCLABLES, HAZARDOUS WASTE, AND GENERAL TRASH ACCORDING TO GUIDELINES.
3. **ARRIVE EARLY:** HIGH DEMAND MEANS SITES CAN FILL QUICKLY; ARRIVING EARLY IMPROVES CHANCES OF SMOOTH DISPOSAL.
4. **UNDERSTAND RESTRICTIONS:** BE AWARE OF WHAT MATERIALS ARE ACCEPTED TO AVOID DENIED ENTRIES OR ADDITIONAL FEES.
5. **CONSIDER ALTERNATIVES:** FOR LARGE OR SPECIALIZED WASTE STREAMS, EXPLORE PRIVATE WASTE HAULERS OR DONATION CENTERS AS COMPLEMENTARY OPTIONS.

White, 2023-02 Segregation Made Them Neighbors investigates the relationship between whiteness and nonwhiteness through the lenses of landscapes and material culture. William A. White III uses data collected from a public archaeology and digital humanities project conducted in the River Street neighborhood in Boise, Idaho, to investigate the mechanisms used to divide local populations into racial categories. The River Street Neighborhood was a multiracial, multiethnic enclave in Boise that was inhabited by African American, European American, and Basque residents. Building on theoretical concepts from whiteness studies and critical race theory, this volume also explores the ways Boise's residents crafted segregated landscapes between the 1890s and 1960s to establish white and nonwhite geographies. White describes how housing, urban infrastructure, ethnicity, race, and employment served to delineate the River Street neighborhood into a nonwhite space, an activity that resulted in larger repercussions for other Boiseans. Using material culture excavated from the neighborhood, White describes how residents used mass-produced products to assert their humanity and subvert racial memes. By describing the effects of racial discrimination, real-estate redlining, and urban renewal on the preservation of historic properties in the River Street neighborhood, Segregation Made Them Neighbors illustrates the symbiotic mechanisms that also prevent equity and representation through historic preservation in other cities in the American West.

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
