In their model, people interact on the understanding that their perceptions of everyday life are shared with others, and this common knowledge of reality is in turn reinforced by this interaction. Social structure can also be said to be the framework upon which a society is established. It determines the norms and patterns of relations between the various institutions of the society. Social norms are believed to influence social structures through relations between the majority and the minority. As those who align with majority are considered ‘normal’ and those who align with the minority are considered ‘abnormal’ majority-minority relations create a hierarchical stratification within social structures that favors the majority in all aspects of society. Social theory by definition is used, to make distinctions and generalizations among different types of societies, and to analyze modernity as it has emerged in the past few centuries. Social thought provides general theories to explain actions and behavior of society as a whole, encompassing sociological, political, and philosophical ideas. Social transformation in this context requires a shift in collective consciousness of a society-local, state, national or global – so that reality is refined by consensus.
