VERSION CONTROL SYSTEMS

ALTHOUGH NOT MANDATORY FOR BEGINNERS, FAMILIARITY WITH GIT AND PLATFORMS LIKE GITHUB OR GITLAB CAN BE ADVANTAGEOUS. THEY FACILITATE COLLABORATION, CODE BACKUP, AND SHOWCASE OF PROJECTS, WHICH ARE IMPORTANT IN PROFESSIONAL CONTEXTS.

COMPARING SELF-TEACHING TO FORMAL EDUCATION

WHILE TEACHING YOURSELF HTML AND CSS OFFERS FLEXIBILITY AND PERSONALIZATION, FORMAL EDUCATION PROVIDES STRUCTURED GUIDANCE AND CREDENTIALING.
