ENGEL'S EXPERIENCE SUGGESTS THAT WHILE HE IS PROFICIENT IN SEVERAL LANGUAGES, THE INTENSITY AND DANGER OF CONFLICT REPORTING OFTEN LIMIT OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERFECT FLUENCY.
