Finally, Licona concludes by addressing the thorny question of whether the editorial moves commonplace in ancient biography are compatible with the doctrines of the divine inspiration and the inerrancy of Scripture. Rather than trying to resolve discrepancies by bending the Gospel narrative, which risks making them say things they aren't saying, *Jesus, Contradicted* situates the Gospels within their proper context and helps readers account for differences in the Gospels in a cohesive and historically cogent way.
