GOOGLE DOCS TEMPLATES OFFER THE ADVANTAGE OF CLOUD ACCESSIBILITY AND EASY COLLABORATION, MAKING THEM SUITABLE FOR FAMILIES COMPILING HISTORIES COLLECTIVELY. HOWEVER, THESE MAY HAVE LIMITATIONS IN DESIGN FLEXIBILITY COMPARED TO DEDICATED DESKTOP SOFTWARE.
