## COMMON GERMAN GREETINGS FOR DIFFERENT TIMES OF DAY

GERMANS OFTEN USE TIME-SPECIFIC GREETINGS THAT ARE SIMILAR TO ENGLISH PHRASES LIKE "GOOD MORNING" OR "GOOD EVENING." HERE ARE SOME POPULAR ONES:

- **GUTEN MORGEN** – GOOD MORNING (USED UNTIL ABOUT 10 OR 11 A.M.)

THESE GREETINGS ARE CONSIDERED POLITE AND ARE ESPECIALLY APPROPRIATE IN FORMAL OR SEMI-FORMAL SITUATIONS. FOR EXAMPLE, WHEN MEETING SOMEONE FOR THE FIRST TIME, IN A BUSINESS SETTING, OR WHEN ADDRESSING ELDERLY, IT'S BEST TO USE "GUTEN TAG" OR "GUTEN MORGEN" INSTEAD OF "HALLO."

## FORMAL VS. INFORMAL GREETINGS: NAVIGATING GERMAN SOCIAL NORMS

ONE OF THE TRICKIER ASPECTS OF SAYING HELLO IN GERMAN IS UNDERSTANDING WHEN TO USE FORMAL VERSUS INFORMAL GREETINGS. GERMAN CULTURE PLACES A STRONG EMPHASIS ON RESPECT AND SOCIAL HIERARCHY, ESPECIALLY IN LANGUAGE.

## INFORMAL GREETINGS: WHEN TO USE "HALLO" AND "HI"

- **SERVUS** – A CASUAL GREETING USED IN SOUTHERN GERMANY AND AUSTRIA
- **MOIN** – A NORTHERN GERMAN GREETING, USED ANY TIME OF DAY
- **NA?** – A VERY CASUAL, ALMOST SLANGY WAY TO SAY “HEY, WHAT’S UP?”

USING THESE GREETINGS APPROPRIATELY CAN HELP YOU CONNECT MORE NATURALLY WITH LOCALS AND SHOW THAT YOU’RE FAMILIAR WITH REGIONAL CUSTOMS.

## FORMAL GREETINGS: WHEN TO USE “GUTEN TAG” AND VARIATIONS

IN PROFESSIONAL OR FORMAL CONTEXTS, IT’S IMPORTANT TO USE THE PROPER GREETINGS. “GUTEN TAG” IS THE SAFEST AND MOST COMMONLY ACCEPTED FORMAL HELLO. WHEN ADDRESSING SOMEONE WITH A TITLE, SUCH AS A PROFESSOR OR A MANAGER, PAIRING “GUTEN TAG” WITH THEIR TITLE AND LAST NAME IS POLITE AND EXPECTED.

FOR EXAMPLE:

*GUTEN TAG, HERR SCHMIDT.* (GOOD DAY, MR. SCHMIDT.)

*GUTEN TAG, FRAU M<sup>U</sup>LLER* (GOOD DAY, MRS. M<sup>U</sup>LLER.)

IN VERY FORMAL LETTERS OR SPEECHES, YOU MIGHT ALSO ENCOUNTER “SEHR GEEHRTE DAMEN UND HERREN,” WHICH TRANSLATES TO “DEAR LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,” BUT THIS IS MORE OF A WRITTEN SALUTATION THAN A SPOKEN GREETING.

## REGIONAL VARIATIONS: HOW DO YOU SAY HELLO IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF GERMANY?

GERMANY IS A COUNTRY WITH DIVERSE DIALECTS AND REGIONAL EXPRESSIONS, AND GREETINGS ARE NO EXCEPTION. DEPENDING ON WHERE YOU ARE, THE WAY PEOPLE SAY HELLO CAN VARY QUITE A BIT.

### GREETINGS IN BAVARIA AND AUSTRIA

IN BAVARIA (SOUTHERN GERMANY) AND AUSTRIA, “SERVUS” IS A POPULAR GREETING USED BOTH WHEN MEETING AND SAYING GOODBYE. IT’S INFORMAL BUT WIDELY ACCEPTED AND ADDS A FRIENDLY, LOCAL FLAVOR TO YOUR CONVERSATIONS.

### GREETINGS IN NORTHERN GERMANY

IN NORTHERN REGIONS SUCH AS HAMBURG OR BREMEN, YOU’LL OFTEN HEAR “MOIN” OR “MOIN MOIN.” ALTHOUGH ORIGINALLY MEANING “MORNING,” IT’S USED THROUGHOUT THE DAY AS A CASUAL HELLO.

### SWABIAN AND OTHER DIALECTS

IN SOUTHWESTERN GERMANY, PARTICULARLY IN THE SWABIAN DIALECT AREA, GREETINGS LIKE “GR<sup>U</sup>ß<sup>E</sup> GOTT” (LITERALLY

“GREET GOD”) ARE COMMON. WHILE IT SOUNDS FORMAL OR RELIGIOUS, IT’S ACTUALLY USED AS A FRIENDLY WAY TO SAY HELLO IN EVERYDAY LIFE.

## BODY LANGUAGE AND CULTURAL TIPS WHEN SAYING HELLO IN GERMAN

LANGUAGE IS MORE THAN JUST WORDS; IT’S ALSO ABOUT HOW YOU PRESENT YOURSELF. WHEN GREETING SOMEONE IN GERMANY, BODY LANGUAGE PLAYS A ROLE IN MAKING A GOOD IMPRESSION.

- **HANDSHAKE:** IN FORMAL SITUATIONS, A FIRM HANDSHAKE IS THE STANDARD GREETING. IT’S CUSTOMARY TO MAKE EYE CONTACT DURING THE HANDSHAKE AS A SIGN OF RESPECT AND SINCERITY.

- **PERSONAL SPACE:** GERMANS TEND TO VALUE PERSONAL SPACE, SO AVOID STANDING TOO CLOSE WHEN SAYING HELLO.

FOR CLOSE FRIENDS AND FAMILY, HUGS OR CHEEK KISSES (USUALLY THREE QUICK KISSES ALTERNATING CHEEKS) ARE COMMON, ESPECIALLY IN SOUTHERN GERMANY AND AUSTRIA.

## HOW DO YOU SAY HELLO IN GERMAN ON THE PHONE?

ANSWERING THE PHONE IN GERMAN HAS ITS OWN ETIQUETTE. THE MOST COMMON WAY TO SAY HELLO WHEN PICKING UP A CALL IS SIMPLY:

- HALLO?
- GUTEN TAG? (MORE FORMAL)
- JA, BITTE? (MEANING “YES, PLEASE?” USED WHEN YOU’RE READY TO LISTEN)

INTERESTINGLY, UNLIKE ENGLISH, GERMANS OFTEN DON’T SAY “THIS IS [NAME] SPEAKING” RIGHT AWAY BUT WAIT FOR THE CALLER TO IDENTIFY THEMSELVES FIRST.
