THE ORIGINS OF PETER PAN BY JAMES M BARRIE

BARRIE'S INSPIRATION FOR PETER PAN CAME FROM HIS FRIENDSHIP WITH THE LLEWELYN DAVIES FAMILY, PARTICULARLY THE FIVE YOUNG BOYS, WHOSE PLAYFUL SPIRIT AND ADVENTURES IN KENSINGTON GARDENS SPARKED THE CREATION OF NEVERLAND AND ITS ETERNAL CHILD.

BARRIE'S WRITING CAPTURED THE IMAGINATION OF EDWARDIAN SOCIETY, WITH THE PLAY'S PREMIERE IN LONDON BECOMING AN INSTANT SENSATION. THE THEATRICAL PRODUCTION COMBINED FANTASY, HUMOR, AND A TOUCH OF MELANCHOLY, SETTING THE STAGE FOR PETER PAN TO BECOME A CULTURAL ICON.

THE IMPACT AND LEGACY OF PETER PAN BY JAMES M BARRIE
