Q: How would you value a company with negative earnings? A: When a company has negative earnings, methods like DCF and comparable multiples based on earnings may not be appropriate. Instead, you can use: Revenue multiples (EV/Revenue). Adjusted EBITDA multiples if the company has positive cash flow before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization. Asset-based valuation, particularly in distressed situations. 7. Brain Teasers / Problem Solving Q: How many gas stations are there in the U.S.? A: This question is testing your ability to think logically. Example approach: U.S. population is roughly 330 million. Estimate there's 1 car for every 2 people (165 million cars). Each car needs gas about once per week. Assume a gas station serves 2,000 cars per week. Divide 165 million by 2,000: around 82,500 gas stations. By preparing answers that demonstrate strong technical skills, awareness of current market conditions, and teamwork abilities, you'll be ready to tackle both the technical and behavioural parts of your investment banking interview.
