Ihre Vampire waren nicht mehr die seelenlosen Monster, sondern verehrte Wesen, deren Zustand zwischen Leben und Tod als Geschenk und nicht als Fluch angesehen wurde. Das Fremde und Andere in Gestalt des Grafen Dracula wurde verdammt, das Leben von Rice Vampiren allerdings als äußerst erstrebenswert erachtet. Wurden in dieser Arbeit nur zwei, wenn auch sehr grundlegende, Werke mit weitreichender Verbreitung behandelt, so zeigt sich bereits hier, dass es die eine stereotype Darstellung des Vampirs nicht gibt.
