Found guilty of first-degree murder in the stabbing death of a young woman, Laskey was sentenced to die in the electric chair, later commuted to life in prison when the U.S. Supreme Court ruled the death penalty unconstitutional. Despite years of positive achievements while incarcerated and rapidly failing health, public uproar in opposition to Laskey's parole left him behind bars where he died in 2007, just shy of his 70th birthday.
