THE EARLY DAYS: FOUNDATIONS SET AMID CONFLICT

PASADENA'S ORIGINS TRACE BACK TO THE LATE 19TH CENTURY, WHEN IT WAS FOUNDED BY SETTLERS WHO WERE DRAWN TO ITS MILD CLIMATE AND FERTILE LAND. YET, BENEATH THE PROMISE OF A NEW START, THE AREA WAS NOT IMMUNE TO THE DARKER STRUGGLES COMMON TO THE AMERICAN WEST DURING THIS ERA.

DISPLACEMENT OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

BEFORE PASADENA BECAME A HAVEN FOR SETTLERS, IT WAS HOME TO THE TONGVA PEOPLE, INDIGENOUS INHABITANTS WHO LIVED IN THE REGION FOR THOUSANDS OF YEARS. THE ARRIVAL OF SPANISH MISSIONARIES AND LATER AMERICAN SETTLERS LED TO THE DISPLACEMENT AND DECIMATION OF NATIVE COMMUNITIES. THIS PATTERN OF FORCED REMOVAL AND CULTURAL ERASURE REMAINS AN OFTEN UNSPOKEN CHAPTER IN PASADENA'S HISTORY.

UNDERSTANDING THIS ASPECT IS CRUCIAL, AS IT HIGHLIGHTS THE OFTEN PAINFUL TRANSITIONS CITIES UNDERGO DURING COLONIZATION AND EXPANSION. THE TONGVA'S CONNECTION TO THE LAND WAS SEVERED, AND THEIR STORIES WERE OVERSHADOWED BY THE NARRATIVES OF DEVELOPMENT AND PROGRESS.

RACIAL SEGREGATION AND SOCIAL STRUGGLES IN PASADENA

LIKE MANY AMERICAN CITIES, PASADENA WAS NOT EXEMPT FROM THE RACIAL DIVIDES THAT DEFINED MUCH OF THE 20TH CENTURY. THE DARK HISTORY OF PASADENA INCLUDES PERIODS MARKED BY SEGREGATION, DISCRIMINATORY HOUSING PRACTICES, AND RACIAL VIOLENCE.

THE RISE AND IMPACT OF REDLINING

IN THE EARLY TO MID-1900S, PASADENA WAS DEEPLY AFFECTED BY REDLINING—A DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICE WHERE BANKS AND INSURANCE COMPANIES WOULD DENY SERVICES OR CHARGE HIGHER RATES TO RESIDENTS IN CERTAIN NEIGHBORHOODS, PREDOMINANTLY THOSE INHABITED BY AFRICAN AMERICANS AND OTHER MINORITIES. THIS CREATED STARK DIVIDES IN THE CITY'S DEMOGRAPHICS, SHAPING PASADENA'S SOCIO-ECONOMIC LANDSCAPE IN LASTING WAYS.

REDLINING CONTRIBUTED TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF RACIALLY HOMOGENOUS NEIGHBORHOODS, LIMITING ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES FOR MARGINALIZED COMMUNITIES. THE SCARS OF THESE POLICIES ARE STILL VISIBLE TODAY IN THE FORM OF WEALTH GAPS AND NEIGHBORHOOD DISPARITIES.

NOTABLE INCIDENTS OF RACIAL TENSION

THROUGHOUT PASADENA'S HISTORY, THERE WERE MOMENTS OF SIGNIFICANT RACIAL UNREST. IN THE 1940S AND 1950S,

AFRICAN AMERICAN RESIDENTS FACED HOSTILITY WHEN MOVING INTO PREDOMINANTLY WHITE NEIGHBORHOODS. THESE TENSIONS SOMETIMES ERUPTED INTO VIOLENT CONFRONTATIONS OR RESULTED IN THE REINFORCEMENT OF EXCLUSIONARY COVENANTS—LEGAL AGREEMENTS PREVENTING THE SALE OF PROPERTY TO NON-WHITE BUYERS.

HISTORIC CRIME SCENES AND INFAMOUS FIGURES

THE 1933 LONG BEACH EARTHQUAKE AFTERMATH

FLOODS AND FIRES

- **POLICE BRUTALITY CASES:** PASADENA HAS HAD ITS SHARE OF CONTENTIOUS INTERACTIONS BETWEEN LAW
