FURTHERMORE, THE BOOK CONTRIBUTES TO CULTURAL CONVERSATIONS ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH, BODY POSITIVITY, AND GENDER ROLES. BY FOREGROUNDING THE MALE BODY AS A SITE OF BOTH POWER AND FRAGILITY, GIRALDI EXPANDS THE DIALOGUE SURROUNDING GENDER AND EMBODIMENT.
